## SHOW SYNOPSIS

Following the end of the Civil War, many former slaves, anxious to leave the South and the increasing disappointments and dangers of Reconstruction, took advantage of The Homestead Act and went West to build new lives for themselves and their families. Many of these homesteaders were black women who overcame tremendous odds to work their own land and make a place for themselves in an often harsh and forbidding environment. Set in 1898, FLYIN' WEST is the story of some of these African-American female pioneers who settled together in the all-black town of Nicodemus, Kansas.



## MEET THE DIRECTOR

#### **Terrance Afer-Anderson**

After 36 years, Terrance is returning home with this production of Pearl Cleage's Flyin' West. It is a noteworthy homecoming, as his directorial debut, at a theatre he helped found, was Samm-Art Williams' Home. Since those early days, Terrance has gone on to direct more than 50 productions for the stage and screen. These include Generic productions of Extremities, Hunter!, Steal Away, Pantomime, The Red Shoes, and The Tinderbox. His community work as a director includes The Elephant Man, A Soldier's Play, Wait Until Dark, Dutchman, The Island, Sizwe Bansi Is Dead, and his own works The Tribesman, Cast in History, The Outlyers, The Sidon Six, Railings!, Hiram & Nettie, and For the



Love of Jazz. In 2019, Terrance began directing films. His first two feature films have garnered much international attention. His most recent *The Angels in the Details* has won honors in Rome, London, Paris, Cannes, Greece, India, and a U.S. Telly Award.

#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Ever since I was a small child, I have been at once fascinated and humbled by African American history, the irrepressible spirit and distinctive resourcefulness of people who define my very own roots. I had personal experiences in my youth that, while a reflection of what Black people who came before me endured, pale in comparison to the rabid inequities that assailed those giants. I have made efforts to pay tribute to them as an artist and have been especially interested in sharing obscure stories of genuine pioneers. In 2010, I was commissioned by the City of Norfolk to write, produce, and direct a stage drama on African American history. Entitled *Cast in History*, it was staged at the Historic Attucks Theatre, featuring the stories of more than a dozen notables from Norfolk's compelling history. I also wrote, produced, and directed *The Outlyers*, the tale of a ragtag group of runaway



slave children who take a dangerous foray into the Great Dismal Swamp. And when asked to direct Pearl Cleage's *Flyin' West*, I jumped at the opportunity. African American women are the unheralded heroes of American might and the extraordinary story of Nicodemus, Kansas is one worthy of perpetual re-telling. Having the cast join me in researching the incredible story of this oldest African American settlement West of the Mississippi has been a wonder and a joy. We invite you to take this powerful and emotional journey with us.

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
